Pastor's Column:

I write this praying for your growth in Christ, as I was called to serve as a pastor/shepherd this summer at PFC. Are you a part of the church, or do you just "go to church?"

As it has been said, "there is no doing without being." What makes one a part of Palouse Federated Church? Does weekly attendance do that? How is spotty attendance a reflection of how members value corporate worship and fellowship? Does the world believe our lives belong to God as the church? Hopefully thought-provoking questions will do more than generate mere heat, but turn us to the light of God's Word (Ps. 119:105).

When I was growing up on the mission field of the Philippines, a youth group visited for a couple of weeks, and I still remember a song that they left with us. Here are the catchy words to four stanzas, with the course being the last two lines:

1. **The church is not a building where people go to pray;
it's not made out of sticks and stones, it's not made out of clay.**
2. **You can go to worship but you cannot go to church;
You can't find a building that's alive no matter how you search.**
3. **The church is not a business, a committee or a board;
It's not a corporation for the business of the Lord.**
4. **The church, it is the people, living out their lives,
called, enlightened, sanctified for the work of Jesus Christ.**

**We are the church, the body of our Lord;
We are all God's children. We have been restored.**

Do you know what the last verse means? Here are at least two biblical definitions:

The church is an inter-connected body of individual members who value the life of the body of Christ and submission to Him as their head more than they value their very own lives!

The church is the Gospel made visible! The world sees the Gospel best by the Church being and doing what God has designed it to do: preach the Gospel, administer the sacraments/ordinances of baptism and the Lord's Supper, and joyfully live out the "one-another's."

It is my prayer that when Pastor Corey returns to PFC that he finds the members eager, yes, even hungry to hear the Word of God and eager to love God and one another through the use of spiritual gifts and acts of service.

It has been a delight, humble honor, and sincere joy to serve you this summer through preaching, bible studies, and weekly prayer with Pastor Mark for all of you. We will return to Portland Aug. 15th. Thank you to so many who loved us as Christ led you!

Books Pastor Phil is Reading:

My approach to reading all of these books is not the same, but like Pastor Corey some are read slowly, some quickly, and others are for seminary classes or personal interest. Asterisked books are strongly recommended.

The Church: The Gospel Made Visible, by Mark Dever. This 166 page book is a basic biblical theology of the who, what, when, where, why and how of the church.

**Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy*, by Eric Metaxas—545ish pages. Wow! Read it if you like historical WW II detail, mingled with Christian Ethics, political theory, and just great writing.

The Holiness of God, RC Sproul—215 pages. This is serving as my primer (apart from God's Word) on a topic that I'm committing to study, found in the title of this book.

Protecting Your Church against Sexual Predators, by Voyle Glover—133 pages. This book is a must read for all who desire to serve in the ministry full time either volunteering or as paid staff. It is a sad eye opener but provides great insight from a seasoned Christian lawyer who loves the Church.

The Glorious Pursuit: Embracing the Virtues of Christ, by Gary Thomas—180ish pages. This author has written many books on the Christian life, and he relies heavily on the classics to address the topic of spiritual formation.

**God's Will*, by J.I. Packer & Carolyn Nystrom—272 pages. This is a well balanced approach from one of the world's best living theologians. We can save ourselves the trouble of falling off one of the two ends of a slippery spectrum by reading this.

The Life of David Brainerd, by Jonathan Edwards—350 pages. I'm getting ready to be humbled by the life of a missionary to the Native Americans (who died young) as I start this book.

As I continue to go through piles and piles of things I cannot live without, I came across a picture of Mom from long ago. It was taken at the home the three Bagott kids grew up in on Mohr Street which is now owned by Steve and Robin Shoemaker. I'm not exactly sure when the picture was taken but I would guess the early 50s. The Mission Circle decided to collect Gold-Medal Flour coupons to get silverware for our church and Mother was in charge of getting them all together. Other items were purchased also, like the serving tray Mom is holding and the Coffee and Tea service still in use today during more formal occasions. Those were the days when there were many many loaves of bread, delicious homemade rolls, cakes and pies made from scratch at home, long before cakes mixes and the bounty of store bought pastries were so plentiful, so there were plenty of coupons.



At the time, if you had enough coupons, there was very little money required to purchase the silverware, boy those were the good old days. I remember in the newly established Federated Church down on church street, when we would have potluck dinners on a Sunday evening, it was one of the responsibilities of the kitchen crew to count the silverware before people went home, not that anybody was stealing it but you know how spoons and forks get lost in tea towels that wrapped up the food offerings brought from home - plastic wraps and baggies were also items of the future. Doing dishes was a bit more of a challenge in that church, while we did have running water in the kitchen, it was just cold water so big pots were filled with water and carried over to the wood cook stove to heat it up, a far cry from what we do now, just a scrape, rinse and place them in the dishwasher

The pattern that was selected was Queen Bess. We now have many varieties of flatware. Just like many of you ladies in the congregation have done in the past, a few months ago I collected all of the Queen Bess silverware, took it home and a friend of mine and I polished it. Then we took a knife, fork and spoon and wrapped it in a napkin with a paper collar around it like they do in many restaurants today. That silverware is now located on the bottom pullout drawer under the plastic containers of the loose silverware we use for everyday. It is my hope that we will be able to use the wrapped silverware for special dinner occasions. After it is used, when you take it out of the dishwasher, if you would put it in the container next to the wrapped silverware I will keep watch and get it wrapped and returned, ready for the next occasion.

Over the 60+ years we have used this silverware, the numbers have dwindled some. While we have plenty of knives we are a bit short on forks and especially teaspoons. I have placed a picture of the Queen Bess pattern in this article so if you like yard sales and thrift stores and see some of this pattern, if you would purchase it you will be reimbursed



We have some 50 complete wrapped sets of silverware, and while the design is not quite as defined, after thousands and thousands of washing, I think the Mission Circle's efforts left quite a useful and practical legacy for us,. (Now you know why I "fuss" over the silverware at times) I do love our rich church history and often relive many happy memories as I participate in our varied worship activities here at Palouse Federated Church.

A New Season of Ministry – Pastor Mark

I've heard it said that "The most common mistake we make in understanding God's will is this: We get a right idea about what he wants us to do, but we miss His timing in carrying it out." I believe God's timing is never late, and rarely early, yet always on time. However there are times we doubt our faith in God's plan and we ask questions like "Why Me?" or "Why Now?" As we trust more, by surrendering more, we learn to recognize God's voice. As is written in John 10:

²⁷ My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸ I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one will snatch them out of my hand. ²⁹ My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand. ³⁰ I and the Father are one."

I hate to think of the times I've missed out on divine appointments or God's blessings because I didn't recognize His voice, or I didn't trust his calling. Yet I feel that I'm amidst a defining moment where he is calling for me to make a change.

Starting in early winter I looked at my schedule of working as many as five part time jobs in one week and asked, "Is this really the calling God created me for?" Due to working many long hours for the church, Young Life and other income sources, my pregnant wife and young daughter Hatley were very lonely on evenings and weekends. So in April, I started the conversation with leaders of our church that my role at PFC will be changing in the fall. Knowing that we would have a 2nd child in the home I couldn't afford to keep working extended hours. This was a very difficult decision to make being that I not only love to work, but I love the work God has provided!

Not knowing what God had in store for our family we recently found out in the month of July. The administration from the Tekoa School District called me a few weeks ago letting me know that their Ag Teaching Position in their high school was available. This position has been my ideal teaching position ever since I student taught there in 2005. Long story made short: I applied, interviewed, and accepted the position at Tekoa that starts this fall.

This new ministry as a teacher (I refuse to call any vocation simply a "job") will have some major changes to my family's schedule, but many things will stay the same. First and foremost, we will continue to reside in Palouse and be part of the PFC family. As for my paid ministry roles, I will transition into a part time teacher-staff with Young Life. Unfortunately I will be stepping down from the role of the paid Associate Pastor position I currently have with the church. I anticipate a transition period for PFC this fall with an opportunity for the church to consider who God might lead to serve in the capacity of associate pastor. I have been corresponding with Corey through the summer and he is excited for my new ministry.

As difficult as this decision is for me emotionally, I know spiritually and intellectually we as a family are making the correct decision. We invite you to celebrate with us in my new position as a teacher. I truly appreciate the love and support you have generously given to our family. I feel that I'm entering a new season of life, and I have no doubt that a future season would lead me back toward a pastoral ministry in some capacity. I witnessed God's provision and blessing with many relationships as your associate pastor and through faith we know HE will continue to provide and bless our community through different leadership of our church. He may be calling YOU to help be that leader!

The greatest way you can support me is to pray for my family and our church family. Pray that God's will would be done, and that we would allow HIS ways to be our ways. Pray specifically for Pastor Corey, and the church board to have wisdom in where to proceed with the vacancy of my position.

Bible Reading Plan: ~

We continue our goal of reading the whole Bible through in one-year. There are many different ways to achieve this goal. The schedule mapped out below is a chronological schedule. The intent is to read the Bible in the actual order that it "unfolded." If you want to do something different than chronological, consider going to:

<http://www.bibleplan.org> and take advantage of the many different free plans they offer on that website. If you don't do internet, consider simply doing this: read 2 chapters of the New Testament a day, and 2 chapters of the Old Testament a day. When you finish the New Testament (which will be much sooner than you finish the Old Testament) consider shifting your 2 chapters of reading over to the Old Testament- OR- read 2 chapters of the Gospels each day. Either way you will more than read the whole Bible in a year if you read 4 chapters of scripture each day. There are 929 chapters in the 66 book Bible, so you can get away with reading 3 chapters a day- but reading 4 will help you keep pace and will help you personalize and read areas twice that are especially helpful for you.

Following tragic events, you often hear people say, "Where was God?" or "How could God let that happen?" He is with the people around the world who have been touched by this event and have sent in hundreds of thousands of dollars to help pay hospital bills of the 12 who continue to require intensive care. And, of course, He is also with the young man who now sits in a jail cell who may or may not be aware of the magnitude of his actions.
