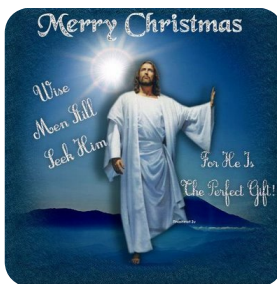

Prayer Evangelism:

We continue our journey through the Westminster Shorter Catechism (WSC). A catechism is simply a question and answer format used to teach basic lessons. The basic lessons of Christianity taught in the WSC are profoundly important. The questions we address today relate Christ's humiliation and exaltation.

Question #27:

Q: Wherein did Christ's humiliation consist?

A: Christ's humiliation consisted in his being born, and that in a low condition,¹ made under the law,² undergoing the miseries of this life,³ the wrath of God,⁴ and the cursed death of the cross;⁵ in being buried, and continuing under the power of death for a time.⁶

1. **Luke 2:7.** And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn.
2. **Philippians 2:6-8.** Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: but made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: and being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.
3. **2 Corinthians 8:9.** For ye know the grace of our

Lord Jesus Christ, that, though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich.

4. **Galatians 4:4.** But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law.

5. **Isaiah 53:3.** He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

6. **Matthew 27:46.** And about the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying, Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani? that is to say, My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?

7. **Luke 22:41-44.** And he was withdrawn from them about a stone's cast, and kneeled down, and prayed, saying, Father, if thou be willing, remove this cup from me: nevertheless not my will, but thine, be done. And there appeared an angel unto him from heaven, strengthening him. And being in an agony he prayed more earnestly: and his sweat was as it were great drops of blood falling down to the ground.

8. **Galatians 3:13.** Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed is every one that hangeth on a tree.

9. **1 Corinthians 15:3-4.** For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; and that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures.

PastorC: I have no comment, except to say read the above scriptures and give thanks and praise to Jesus for coming to us and suffering for our sakes.

Q: Wherein consisteth Christ's exaltation?

A: Christ's exaltation consisteth in his rising again from the dead on the third day,¹ in ascending up into heaven, in sitting at the right hand of God the Father,² and in coming to judge the world at the last day.³

1. **1 Corinthians 15:3-4.** For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; and that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures.
2. **Acts 1:9.** And when he had spoken these things, while they beheld, he was taken up; and a cloud received him out of their sight.

3. **Ephesians 1:19-20.** And what is the exceeding greatness of his power to us-ward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power, which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him from the dead, and set him at his own right hand in the heavenly places.
4. **Acts 1:11.** Which also said, Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? this same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven.
5. **Acts 17:31.** Because he hath appointed a day, in the which he will judge the world in righteousness by that man whom he hath ordained; whereof he hath given assurance unto all men, in that he hath raised him from the dead.

PastorC: We serve a risen Savior! A Living God! Yes, the Son of God descended by becoming human- that's what we celebrate in Christmas. But we remember that He is also the one who now sits at the right hand of God in Heaven.

We are journeying through the catechism to remind us of the basics of Christianity. Remember this Christmas season that we serve a God who came down to us, even suffered and died for us- but He is also alive and exalted. Amen!- Pastor Corey

Celebration: Discipline of the Month ~ Tina Laughary

It feels natural to celebrate in December. We have so much to celebrate. We celebrate the coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ to redeem our world and save us from the consequences of our own sinfulness. Not to mention the gathering of family and friends; which always reminds me of how blessed I am. But did you know that celebration is a discipline?

We serve the God who created joy. Joy is a gift, a fruit of the spirit, an expression of who God is. The angels proclaimed the Joy of God when they welcomed Jesus into the world that first Christmas night. In the book of John Jesus tells his disciples of the great joy within Him that he wished to share. Joy makes us stronger, enables peace and patience. Joy can help us withstand the pain and sadness we will experience in this broken world. Another wonderful attribute of joy is that it is attainable. You can cultivate more joy into your life. Joy comes through obedience.

For 14 months I have been writing articles about the Spiritual Disciplines and how you can practice them in your life. I have described in many different ways what a spiritual discipline is. The truth is, they all boil down to one thing—obedience. Obedience is doing what you believe is God's best for you and your life. It is not always convenient; in fact it is almost never convenient. The apostle Paul tells us that no discipline is pleasant at the time but that the end result of all that obedience, all that discipline is character, integrity, becoming the person God created you to be. As this happens, you will find more joy in your life.

Celebration is the natural outpouring of that joy. The question then becomes, if celebration is a natural outflow of joy, why is it a discipline? The answer is sad but true. The sinfulness of our world seeks to steal our joy, not celebrate it. There will always be serious and important things that "need" our attention. It is another case of the "good" being the enemy of the "best". We can become so consumed by the immediate needs in our life that we never seem to find the time to just celebrate. God's faithfulness to us, his intentional nurturing of our character deserves to be celebrated. We must take time in our schedules to express our joy through celebration.

Celebration may take on many forms but is usually done corporately with other believers. Celebration usually involves laughter, music, singing, dancing and food. Celebrate the big events in life like birthdays, weddings, anniversaries, retirements and baptisms. But also important are the smaller events that should be celebrated like, reuniting with a dear friend, finishing a project at work or a semester at school. During this Christmas season, reflect on all of the time, money and attention we give to celebrating on Christmas. What would life be like if we took just a fraction of this effort to celebrate the joy of everyday life. We need more intentional, God honoring celebration in our lives. Don't just have good intentions. Plan it out. Make it happen. Let's make 2014 a year of discipline, a year to cultivate joy and a year to celebrate.

How do you think of the innkeeper in Bethlehem?

We see him portrayed as a grumpy man who shut the door in Joseph's face. In Derric Johnson's book *The Wonder of Christmas* he gives a different interpretation of what might have gone on with the innkeeper and his story entitled - I Did The Best I Could

Joseph and Mary were in a hurry at Bethlehem. It had been a long 80 mile journey from Nazareth, and the time of Mary's delivery was at hand. It was logical that they would stop at my place of business. I am the innkeeper. Now mind you, I'm not the only innkeeper in Bethlehem, just the one you remember. And I'm afraid you remember me for the wrong reason.

Oh, it's true I told him "I don't have a room to give you. No, not for any price. The whole town is full."

Joseph pled with me because his wife was ready to give birth any minute. I'll never forget the pleading sound in his voice. It was almost like a prayer. "Please, do something to help us.

Don't turn us away."

I told him, "I understand. Believe me I understand your anxiety and your wife's agony. My wife and I just had a baby boy six months ago."

Joseph pled, "But your understanding doesn't help. We need a closet, or a private corner. Just some place to be alone."

And right here is where you think I really blew it! Hardhearted businessman whose only concern was monetary advantage and profit. But you're wrong. I'd have done anything for that desperate couple. There was no place for them to go. The crowds in town for the tax census had filled up every nook and cranny. People were already sleeping in the streets. I'd have let them stay in our room, but it was already rented.

Here was my solution. We did have a stable at the inn. Not what you'd call grand accommodations, but it did get them off the street and out of the weather.

I sent them there and we brought blankets and water and made them as comfortable as possible.


Just think, think, the hinge

of history became a reality right where I lived. You're right. I didn't have much to offer. But I did what I could to welcome the newborn King. This Christmas, will you do the same?

The idea of the Nativity scene began as a way to tell the story of Jesus' birth to those who could neither read it for themselves from the Latin Bible nor understand the language of the Latin masses. The first written record of this tradition tells us that St. Francis of Assisi organized a living manger scene for his parish in 1223. Then churches everywhere began to encourage the scenes that made the story come alive. Townspeople and parishioners gathered at the manger to sing lovely Christmas hymns. God's love could be better understood through the dramas about the birth of Christ. Nativity displays, whether of large statues or of tiny carved figurines, made sure everyone could understand this chronicle of God's love.

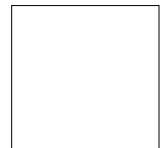
