The staff is excited over every new life. Different resources and Christian love are shared with teen moms regularly. They are ready to help with a message of life, health and hope. Nine out of 10 women who come to a pregnancy center such as Care Net of the Palouse CHOOSE LIFE for their unborn little ones. Their top concern is to help needy moms and their kids since over 750,000 teenagers get pregnant every year in the U.S. This project hopefully made an impact in our communities. THANK YOU.

God has been so faithful. The outpouring of love, prayers and help from our family in Christ all over the world has been overwhelming! Mama and Daddy's church in Palouse has been the best support we could have ever asked for. There are men from the church working to finish the house Daddy is building so that when he is well enough to come home he can come to his house. Family from home on the Peninsula has been such a support, showing so much love and encouragement. I have always been on the giving end of family emergencies not the receiving, and I have never felt anything like it. God is so good. He takes care of His children and never abandons them. When times are hard, if we run to Him, He holds us closer. He is our refuge and our strength when we are spent, helpless and unable to go on. He asks us to simply trust Him, moment by moment. Living day to day we must do just that. Being thankful and rejoicing at the gift of life.

# Habitat for Humanity Progress

At the Habitat House in Palouse, the drumbeat sound of pounding hammers has rested silently this holiday season. As the result of sustained effort during the fall and early winter months, most of the siding is on the exterior of the house; the

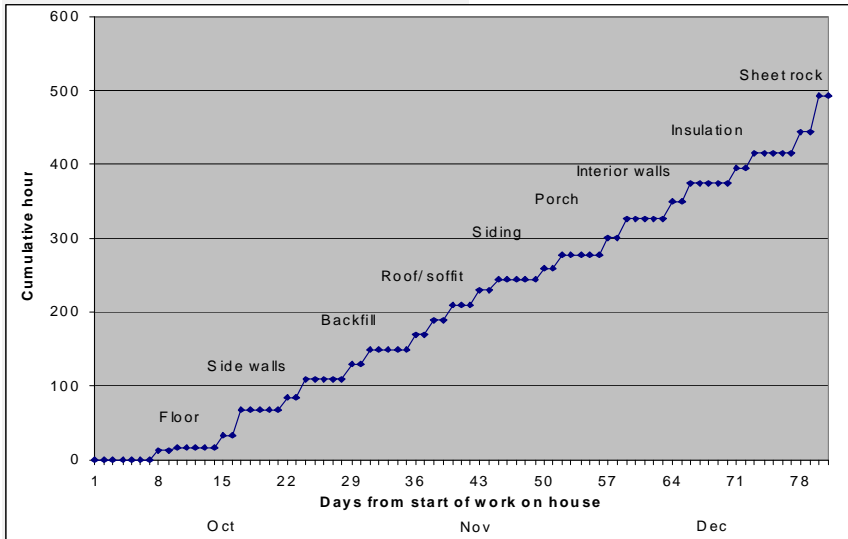
windows and doors have been installed; the plumbing and electrical utilities have been roughed in; the insulation has been installed, and likewise for the sheetrock. Time for the volunteer crews to take a break and enjoy the holiday season.

Collectively, this is a critical milestone in construction of the house. Come January, the sheetrock will be taped and plastered. After that has dried and been sanded, by late January or early

February, **perhaps the old volunteer crews can be joined by some new ones. It will be time for the paint crews, floor installation crews, and the final details finishing crews.**

If you have not yet joined the PFC volunteer crew, now is the time to consider doing so. Your most critical asset need not be talent, but rather a willingness to help. If you need some training, the Habitat for Humanity crews will teach you in what needs to be done. So it's a chance to learn a new skill while helping complete a worthwhile Christian community project with friends. **Our normal work days have been Thursdays (the old duffers club) and Saturdays (often have college kids with lots of energy). - Jan 24th- "Video Lesson- Nooma- Whirlwind"- Learning from the words of Job.



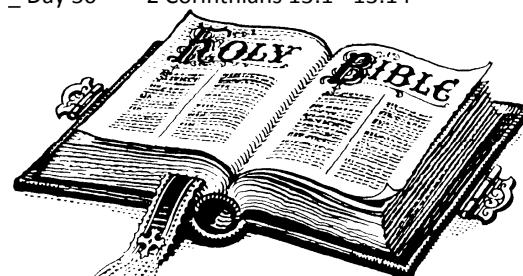
## **Bible Book(s) of the Month –1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Corinthians**

In the next several weeks we will be learning about and discussing the mission of being a follower of Christ, and what it means to be a Christ-following Church. We are going to read 1st and 2nd Corinthians in January and February. The Apostle Paul wrote these to letters to the young church at Corinth. They are full of practical content, on things like what it means to follow Christ, as well as how to approach the Lord's supper, and advice for proper relationships. These are great texts for learning what it means to follow Christ and be a Christ-following congregation. I pray you read these books over the next several weeks. You don't have to read a large chunk of these scriptures to get them done in the prescribed time frame. These short sections of reading allow you to ponder the meaning and application of the scripture. 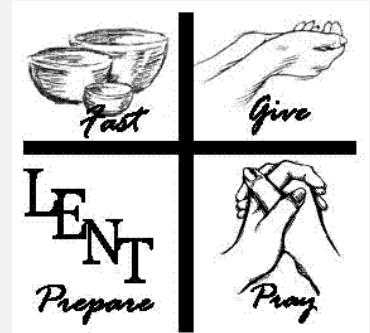
