Pastor's Column: Giving Your Best

A new year is upon us. And make no mistake it is a gift of God. God gives us the gift of life. God is a giver. Everything good thing you have is from God.

As God provides for your needs, God desires that you manage the money and time given you, in order that you can take care of your bills and chores. But God also wants us to be people who contribute to causes larger than our own household. God wants us to be givers.

So as 2011 begins I have a challenge for you.

How much are you going to give away to causes bigger than your own household in 2011? God teaches through the New Testament that followers of Christ should provide for the costs of doing ministry. This means people who worship at a local church, should provide for the needs of the local ministry. Our shared ministry together is funded by our combined gifts to the church. How does one decide what to contribute as an offering to church?

1. Pray and consider what your contribution to our ministry could be. The Bible often encourages giving 10% of your income to local ministry. This is difficult for some and easy for others. If it is easy- ask God if there is more you are to give. If it is hard- work at budgeting and making improvement. Even if you only contribute 1% more than last year- you are making a bigger contribution to our shared ministry together.
2. Once you have considered what you should give- make a plan and consistently stick to it. As long as our income stays consistent, our giving should be consistent. Our giving should not waver depending on what recreational activities we do, or if we miss worship because of illness. Our contribution should be consistent, because it is a reflection of how God has been consistently providing for us. Giving is part of your relationship with God- it is not simply a contribution to the budget, it is a way you give thanks.
3. Pray for the investment of your contributions and take interest in how we put them to work. Together our contributions of time and money take the form of ministries, facilities and resources in the church. If you contribute time and money to the church, you have a right and obligation to see your contribution put to good use. This means chipping in with ideas, effort and constructive criticism towards being the best local church we can be. Your contribution doesn't stop when you put something in the offering plate. The church is made up of God's people- indeed you are the true contribution, your time and money is just part of you contributing yourself.

Thank you to all who gave to support our shared ministry in 2010. Together God used our gifts to do much good in the life of our church and community. And of course God is not done with us- and wants to work through our contributions in 2011. I am grateful for the way the congregation provides for my income- and it is an honor to serve with you in a new year. ~ Pastor Corey

**Brief Book Review –
“Stones Into Schools” by
Greg Mortenson**

Do you believe one person can change the world? I hope you do. The life story of Greg Mortenson is an encouraging story of one man's perseverance to form an organization that builds schools in Central Asia. "Stones into Schools" is his second book about building schools in Afghanistan. Mortenson also wrote "Three Cups of Tea," his story of building schools in Pakistan. Mortenson builds schools for villages that have no schools. He focuses on building schools for girls, as they are often ignored and not provided education.

I encourage you to read one of these books. Consider as you read how much we have in the way of education available in our country.

"Three Cups of Tea"- the audio edition is available for loan in our church library and Pastor Corey has a copy of "Stones into Schools" available for loan. "Stones Into Schools" and "Three Cups of Tea" author and humanitarian **Greg Mortenson is coming to Washington State University Jan. 26th to present the fourth annual Common Reading Invited Lecture, entitled "Promoting Peace Through Education."** It will begin at 7:30 in Beasley Coliseum and be followed with a book signing on the concourse. Tickets for non-students are \$10.

- I will share the good news of Jesus Christ as much as possible.

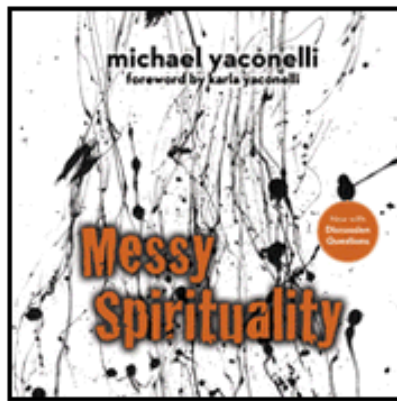
I can do none of the above without Jesus Christ who strengthens me.

Book Review: Messy Spirituality by Michael Yaconelli

“Spirituality is not a formula; it is not a test. It is a relationship. Spirituality is not about competency; it is about intimacy. Spirituality is not about perfection; it is about connection. The way of the spiritual life begins where we are *now* in the mess of our lives. Accepting the reality of our broken, flawed lives is the beginning of spirituality not because the spiritual life will remove our flaws but because we let go of seeking perfection, and instead, seek God, the one who is present in the tangledness of our lives. Spirituality is not about being fixed; it is about God’s being present in the mess of our unfixedness.” (p. 13)



Do you brush your teeth and floss with a little more intensity the week before you go to the dentist? If so, what if the same tendency carries over to your spiritual life? I fall into this category. There are times that myself and other Christians try to sanitize our lives before we go to church. We try to fix our problems on our own, or we attempt to make our life look orderly when the truth is we live a messy life. In Messy Spirituality the author Michael Yaconelli challenges his readers to not check your baggage at the door of the church. We all have temptations, we all have struggles, and he teaches that church should be the one place where we surrender and overcome our sins. The book unfolds that your insecurity, your self-doubt, and your great need for affirmation make you lose trust in your inner voice and run away from yourself. But you know that God speaks to you through your inner voice and that you will find joy and peace only if you follow it.

Messy Spirituality is challenging, yet a simple read. It is a book that many could finish in one or two sittings. Look for it in our church library, and learn how to enjoy a spiritual life that is messy.

2010 Turkey Leg (reprinted 12/31/10 Whitman County Gazette)

Pastor Corey Laughary has participated in the Palouse Library’s Turkey Leg Fun Run every year since 2005. The Turkey Leg fun run is an annual event that raises money for the Palouse Branch Library and two high school scholarships.

As part of the event, members of the Palouse Federated Church and Palouse residents have sponsored Corey, the church pastor. The sponsors challenge Laughary to go above and beyond simply walking or running. In years past, he has been asked to sidestep the entire distance, skip, and walk backwards. He has also eaten a whole pie and pledged to forego eating mashed potatoes.

This year sponsors required Corey to write a song about Palouse and sing it down on Main Street. Always a good sport and willing to humiliate himself for a good cause, he brings in big donations.

One such donation for this year’s Turkey Leg was a pledge of \$512 from Corey’s brother, Clay Laughary.

A math teacher in Renton, Clay Laughary offered to sponsor his brother “2 to the 9th power.” “You figure it out,” he told Corey.

“If I’ve done the math right,” Corey said as his kids sipped hot cocoa at the Green Frog Café, “my brother is donating \$512”. Pastor Corey immediately raced outside to skip up and down Main Street and sang the song he composed about Palouse. He brought in almost half of the Turkey Leg donations so far this year, totaling \$1567.

Proceeds from the library portion of the fundraiser will go toward the purchase of children’s books and music, audio books and young adult literature. For more information or to make a donation, contact the Palouse Library at 878-1513.

- The kitchen floor needs to be addressed. The Health inspector has indicated that the carpet needs to be replaced with hard surface for ease of cleaning by multiple groups. A preliminary bid was presented to replace carpet with high quality vinyl.
- The interior of the parsonage is due for painting. The board motioned to purchase the paint, Tina picking the colors. A volunteer work party will provide the labor. The motion was seconded and approved.

Pastor's Report

- Pastor reported that the new communication cards have been well received. The information allows better communication with the congregation and those first or newly attending.
- The Pastor introduced the board to the book "**Fusion: Turning First-Time Guests into Fully-Engaged Members of Your Church.**" It is being discussed with his Pastor's group and will be the February PFC-LLC Book.
- New Business consisted of a request for \$50.00 to purchase music for the free dance class offered for children at the church, directed by Camile Wadeligh, the request was approved.

The next meeting of the Executive Board will be January 20, 2011 at the church beginning at 7pm. The congregation is encouraged to present ideas and/or concerns to any Board members and is welcomed to attend any of the Board Meetings. The annual business/ministry meeting will be held in the Fellowship Hall as a lunch following the 11AM service on January 30th.

Goodshop and Goodsearch

Do you use the internet? If so, do you use a search engine? Want an easy way to earn some donations for our church? Simply go to www.goodsearch.com and type in Palouse Federated Church as your charity of choice and click "verify." The website will not ask for any personal information.

Then every time you use goodsearch.com to do a search, PFC will get 1 cent per search. It doesn't sound like much- but if 100 of us used it routinely, it would add up to thousands of dollars per year. Pastor Corey has made it his personal favorite search engine. Another way to use goodsearch is their "Goodshop" option this is for people who shop online. Before buying something at amazon or other popular websites, simply go to goodshop first (don't forget to verify Palouse Federated Church as your charity of choice) and enter the website name you are planning on shopping at. Goodshop will take you there and you can do your shopping as normal. Without adding anything to your price or any inconvenience, Goodsearch.com will give a percentage of your purchase to PFC. For example on one purchase in December Pastor Corey made at Amazon.com we received \$2.95 as a donation. So if you shop online consider taking the one extra step of going through "Goodshop.com."



Bible Book(s) of the Month (s) –Proverbs – James – 1 John - Colossians


