PFC ASSESSMENT “Almost Here”

April 30th - May 2nd PFC will be having an “Assessment Weekend” – A Church Assessment is a healthy way for a church to learn about itself to become more effective at serving Christ and community. The Board and Pastor Corey have been working on the assessment for months, and they believe it will be a positive experience for the congregation

We have seen much growth in our church in the last five years. We want to continue to be a healthy church, and never grow stagnant in our journey of serving Christ and loving our neighbors. The assessment will affirm what we are doing well, while providing an objective perspective on growth areas, and ways we could improve reaching the un-churched in our communities.

An assessment will also help us understand how we could be best served by bringing on a part-time associate minister, and what ministry would best be done by a part-time associate pastor.

The events begin on Friday Apr. 30th for Pastor Corey, Tina, the Executive Board and Ministry Leaders.

On Saturday May 1st you are invited to one of four hour-long focus groups- At 9am there are two groups meeting simultaneously- the “Elderberries” (folks who have been part of PFC since prior to 1990) and the “Newberries” (folks who have been part of PFC beginning after 1990). At 10:30am we will have two simultaneous groups- one for worship and music ministries, and another for small group leaders and Sunday school teachers.

If you would prefer a personal interview with a member of the assessment team, please call Butch Smith at 878-1939, and an interview will be arranged for Saturday afternoon.

Important- On Sunday Evening May 2nd at 6pm– we will have a presentation by the assessment team on the results of the assessment. Please attend this time if you can- it will be an encouraging time for our church.

We want you to be a part of Assessment Weekend! We want your voice to be heard. Church leadership planned this event as a positive opportunity for our Church to grow. We trust the expertise of Dr. Revis and the ABCNW team. They have done this process with dozens of churches. Pastor Corey has many colleagues who highly recommend this process as a helpful and positive step in growing as a pastor and helping the church more effectively reach non-Christians in the community.

Please keep the assessment in your prayers- and please participate if you can.

Pastor's Column: "The Half-Life Choice"

"Plans fail for lack of counsel, but with many advisers they succeed."

Proverbs 15:22 ~ (NIV)

When you set out to eat a whole sandwich, you at some point will be half-way through the sandwich. Not everything in life is so easily divisible into halves. For example, when relationships divide, and someone gets "half"- it's anything but clean cut. How do we determine what half is?

If we apply "half-way" to looking at the length of our life, it gets a bit challenging. How do we know if we have lived half our life? I am told that today people in their sixties often see themselves as "middle-aged," but this surely doesn't mean that they will live to get into their 120's. How do we know if we have lived half our life?

If we apply half to a length of a career, or a calling- like pastoring a church, it is an interesting question. Can we predict the "half-way" point of a pastor's term of service at a church? Yes and no. Churches and organizations have habits and patterns just like families and individuals do. These habits and patterns can be observed by noting the history of a congregation, and exploring its tendencies. For example, take our church in its 60 years of existence we have never had a pastor serve more than 8 years. Two pastors served around 6 years, many less than that, and only one served 8. This would mean that the longest expected half-life of a pastor at our church, according to our track record, would be 4 years.

The problem: I am in year 5 and I strongly believe I am called here for the long-term, much longer than 8 years of service. So I have a choice. I can ignore the history and patterns of our church. Or I can make a conscious choice to learn and grow as a leader, praying that God will keep us together to effectively serve Christ and our community for many years to come, that's why I wanted the Church Assessment.

The Board and I together have had a "half-life" choice of sorts. We decided around my 5 year anniversary as pastor to pursue a Church Assessment. Part of a church assessment is the Pastor-Leader learning about his-self, so that he can grow in his health and effectiveness as a leader.

We are busy enough as a church that if I chose to, I could simply throw my leadership into "neutral" and coast out two or three more years as pastor here doing the busy activities of a pastor's life. "Throwing it into neutral" means I would not be seeking any new vision or direction for the church, not worrying about growing myself, or investing in future leaders, but simply taking care of the "urgent" present issues. If I made that kind of choice, one day a couple years from now I would wake up and say, "Tina- it's time we go elsewhere." But this "throwing it into neutral" is a gross violation of my spiritual calling from Christ. It runs counter to all conviction I have had as a leader of our church. So instead I have made the choice to be assessed and to learn and grow as a leader. I am praying that I will always be choosing to see my ministry life as only half-way done.

None of us knows how many days we have left. We don't know our "half-life" but we do know that if we don't prepare to meet the needs of the future, the future will still come at us- and we will simply be unprepared for it. If we don't prepare for the future, we will repeat the patterns of the past. The wisdom of the scriptures teaches us that preparation is a good thing, and that we should seek out the "counsel of many." I am seeking to be a continually growing and prepared leader that is challenged and encouraged by the "counsel of many," in order that I can be a healthy leader in our congregation. So that we can serve Christ and our neighbors well. I am praying that year 6 is my half-way point. But I am also praying, that with some learning and growth, next year I will say that year 7 is my half-way point.

Giving Opportunities Abound - Consider- Consistent- Contributions

Recently a young woman from our Congregation, Ms. Sammie Holden, provided PFC members with opportunities to learn about her exciting mission trip that will begin on May 11th. She will be traveling overseas to Tanzania, with six additional members of Chi Alpha to provide seminars on HIV/AIDS and minister to the villages. In order to do that Sammie and her colleagues must raise **\$21,000** for the mission trip. If you would like to donate please make your tax deductible contribution to **XA missions with Tanzania 2010** and you may either give them to Sammie, Pastor Corey or mail them to Chi Alpha, 740 NE Campus St. Pullman, WA 99163. We will be praying for Sammie on May 2nd at both services as she prepares for her mission trip to Tanzania. Please keep Sammie in your prayers.

Another youth congregational leader, JD Kent, has successfully been selected to participate in as a missionary with Carpenter's Tools International (CTI) Music Ministries. CTI sends music teams of young people all over North America and across the globe to share the Gospel through contemporary music. JD is partnering with this ministry for a 6 week summer music ministry. The cost for the summer program is **\$4,350**, \$2,000 of which has been fronted by the PFC, and \$1,000 of which will be a match from the PFC to other sources. Additional opportunities to give come in the form of the camp scholarship fund that PFC uses each year to provide our youth with scholarships for Christian summer camp at Ross Point.

Do you know what the Kenneth Graves Memorial Resource Table is? We have these resources because of gifts given in memory of Kenneth Graves, a man who died over 4 years ago in a helicopter crash. He was a beloved friend of some folks in our church. Just a few weeks before the crash he had become a Christian and was devotedly reading "The Purpose Driven Life." His loved ones still miss Kenny, but one way his legacy lives on is providing a table full of books that encourage people to grow closer to Jesus. Please feel free to use these resources, either borrow them or take them home, with the intent they end up in the hands of people who could use them to grow in Christ or deal with grief issues. The Kenneth Graves Memorial Resource table is located at the top of the stairs on the main floor, underneath a bulletin board.

Bible Book(s) of the Month –Acts

Acts- The history book of the New Testament. It is widely understood that Luke wrote the book of Acts, which has a longer name, "The Acts of the Disciples." In March 1949, a national broadcast on a Saturday evening asked Americans to give generously the next morning in their churches. A remarkable assembly of national leaders and celebrities gave their efforts to the broadcast, and more than 75,000 churches responded the next day.

Today, One Great Hour of Sharing serves people in over 80 countries around the world. Sponsored by nine Christian U.S. denominations and Church World Service, One Great Hour of Sharing makes sure that we can respond to needs as soon as they happen and that tens of thousands of people receive support for ongoing relief, rehabilitation, and development.

The World Relief Committee of the American Baptist General Board reviews each development request for funding from the One Great Hour of Sharing offering received from American Baptists. Gifts reach the ministries and people in need through a network of regional and international partnerships with the following:

Baptist World Aid - the compassionate arm of the Baptist World Alliance, supporting three areas of ministry: relief, development, and support of national partners;
