Father's Heart Mission Trip ~ Alana Brunner

I thank God for the mighty things He has done here for His faithful ones at Father's Heart and at Hope 4 All Children. I feel so humbled and honored at the same time that He would allow me to take part in it all. Our awesome God and Father is so faithful!

When Angie returned home to Pullman she spoke to Palouse Federated Church about her time here. She told them about a small plot of land with a house that is next to Hope 4 that the orphanage is currently renting. PFC raised and sent funds to help Hope 4 purchase land, Thank you Jesus! On the morning of Thursday, April 26th the leaders at the orphanage got together and prayed about purchasing the land. An hour or so later Pastor Martin went and offered money on the land for sale next door to the orphanage. The land is 150x20ft with a tiny 4 room house on it. The eldest son of the widow who owns the land found out that his mother wanted to sell the land through said offer and he called a family meeting. At this meeting the children of the widow decided against selling the land. Unexpected as this was we trusted God accepted it as His will moving on praying for God to show us what to do with the money you all had sent. We decided upon building another brick hen house, separate from other buildings and a little larger than the other one we are now using as a kitchen *. With 2.2 million Ugandan shillings of the 5 you sent us we purchased materials needed and began work that day. It was a very productive afternoon as all the children helped as we dug and built the foundation.

That night I sat down to begin writing you at PFC a thank you email and to tell you of the changes of plans but the 'L' key on the keyboard flipped out filling the email with llllllllllllllllls, so I gave up and went to bed. I believe this was God's way of making me wait to write this email because He had more to do. The next morning Katali and I headed into Jinja town to visit banks and find out about opening a bank account for a non-profit organization. At each bank we visited there was a list of 8 things needed to open an account such as meeting minutes, letters of recommendation, etc and a land title, which we do not have as Martins family owns the land on which Hope 4 is currently located. We collected the information and took a taxi up to the orphanage. When we arrived Martin informed us that that morning the family who owns the plot of land on the other side of the orphanage had offered us their land for 2.5 million. We explored the small piece of land, 100x20ft and discussed the idea. We then sat down and prayed. We concluded that we would offer the family 2 million and they accepted! The land title will be in the name of Hope 4 All Children of Uganda Just what we need to begin expanding the orphanage for more children as well as for the bank account! God is so awesome! So in conclusion, the funds you sent us purposed for land not only purchased land, but provided funds to build a new hen house, a new room on the primary school and to build a heat efficient 4 burner mud stove in the new kitchen to save on wood costs. The rest of the funds provided the land title needed to open a bank account for the orphanage, to have some left over to bless the men who have been volunteering their time and energy to build these structures as well as to purchase a few things that the children needed. God is so good and that is an understatement!

Godlessness in our Culture & its Affect on Youth ~ Pastor Mark ³

Has it ever occurred to you that our modern American culture, specifically our media and entertainment is not merely sinful but actually anti-Christ? Television, movies and music glorify sinful acts as pleasurable, fulfilling and morally okay; yet the consequence of sin is death and destruction (Romans 6:23). Sin corrupts and leads to more corruption and we act surprised to hear about the heart break and brokenness that is present in our home towns and in our families.

Here in Palouse and Garfield we have multiple kids who deal with depression so severe as to be suicidal, we have teens dependent upon pills to stabilize their thoughts and behaviors, and we have other teens that self-medicate their pain and confusion with alcohol and illegal substances. As the body of Christ, His Church, we cannot be naïve to the problems in our midst. We see and hear the statistics and issues on a national or regional scale, but are we aware that our close-knit community is not immune to the consequences of sin?

I am writing not with a condemning tone, but with the motive to stir up thoughts and more specifically prayers. What our teens need is not trendy clothes, a boyfriend/girlfriend, or success in sports. Our teens need to experience the grace of Christ and knowledge of truth. Right now all our youth seem to be hearing is the opinions of their friends and the messages from our media. As way of example, I had a conversation with a youth member of PFC who sincerely stated to me that, "I don't see what is such a big deal with having sex outside of marriage." My heart broke as I heard this statement come from one of our young we would consider a "good kid". My heart continually breaks as I hear the hurt found in the stories I am told by teens and their utter confusion for what will bring peace and joy to their broken-messy life.

We cannot sit back and let the things of this world take over. We have a great Hope in Christ and we know He is the fulfillment of all needs. So let us be a church body that shares Christ not only in words, but in deeds. Please pray for our youth. Pray for local mission opportunities including Young Life, youth groups, small groups that meet and share the truth of God. Prayer is the greatest feat we can do because apart from God we can do nothing (John 15:5). I would much rather have dedicated praying people for our youth than dedicated financial donors. That is a hard statement to write, but it is a truth of ministry that focuses our dependence on faith, not on logic, experience or talent.

"So let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." Hebrews 4:16

Fire Destroys Bible School

A fire has destroyed the Kawthoolei Karen Baptist Bible School and College and other buildings in Mae La Refugee Camp on the Thailand/Myanmar border. Camp residents managed to put out the fire after about an hour. "The Bible School has a long history and has been instrumental in so many ways as a ministry to the refugees [from Myanmar] along the Thailand/Myanmar border," according to Stan Murray, American Baptist International Ministries (IM) area director for Southeast Asia and Japan. "The school trained young people who then serve in ministry both in the refugee camps and in the countries where many of the refugees are settling, including in the U.S."

The news of the fire came from IM missionaries Duane and Marcia Binkley who are now traveling in Myanmar. The Binkley's share this email message from Blooming Night Zan, resident of a nearby town. "The fire started from Pastor Simon's house.... Everything was completely destroyed. Only the frame of the building was left." She continues, "Many of you will remember the place where you sleep, you eat, you worship, you tell the words of God, the place where more than 300 students gather and study, now was destroyed by fire.... God will provide what his children need."

The Kawthoolei Karen Baptist Bible School & College was established and started on June 9th, 1983 at Htee K'Haw, near Mae La village in Pa-an district of Kawthoolei (Karen State). In 1990, the long existing civil war between the Karen and the Burmese (which began in 1949) made it necessary for it to move to its current location at the Mae La Refugee Camp in Thailand. American Baptists were part of the organizing bodies and have supported this school since its arrival at Mae La through encouragement, donations, and volunteers.

The Laughary Family Sabbatical

Preface: Pastor Corey is being given a two month sabbatical this summer from June 15th-August 15th. The Pastoral Relations Committee asked Tina to write an article explaining what this sabbatical will mean for the Laughary family. This is what she told us:

I will never forget the first time I felt like I was really a pastor's wife. It was late May of 2003. I was just about 2 weeks away from having Danny, our first child. It was a beautiful Saturday afternoon and Corey and I were picnicking with my family at a lake. We were just about to step into my brother's boat for a ride when Corey received a phone call. A member of the church where Corey had been serving as interim pastor had just suffered cardiac arrest and was taken to the hospital where they were not able to save him. Corey looked at me with apprehension. Should he leave his very pregnant wife? Would I understand? I thought of that poor woman who had ridden in an ambulance with her husband and was now sitting in the hospital alone—a brand new widow. "Go...hurry" was all I said. Of course I wanted him to be with her, to offer some peace, some comfort. He was to be a symbol of God's love and protection in this time of pain and sadness.

That was the first time my husband's calling took precedence over our family plans and it certainly hasn't been the last. I always want Corey to go. In the middle of the night, the middle of dinner, during a school concert or family birthday, whenever there is need. I always want people who are hurting to have their pastor with them. I won't pretend that I am not sometimes disappointed by the timing of such occasions. But I always understand.

I guess the peace I feel comes from a deep assurance of our calling. I am 100% positive that God has called Corey and me to the town of Palouse. We are exactly where He wants us to be. He continues to equip us and strengthen us for this ministry He has called us to. That doesn't mean it is easy. Being God's messenger can be heartbreaking work and I often ache for the difficult situations Corey has to deal with. He sees a lot of pain and suffering and though God gives him the strength to deal with it all—it takes a toll. He has to be disciplined about keeping himself healthy so that he is able to give of himself to others.

I don't always know if I do a good job communicating to the children. We try to explain Corey's job to them and I think they understand it most of the time but they have a lot of questions. I don't want their disappointment over Daddy being gone or distracted occasionally to show up as resentment for God. Our children have learned more about sickness and death much earlier than most kids and I think that is ok. God is using these circumstances to develop compassion and empathy in their character. We have learned not to "promise" them certain things. Even vacations and family outings are contingent on, "unless something comes up". This is the MAIN thing I am looking forward to about Sabbatical, two months of family time with no contingencies. I was surprised at just how excited all 3 of them were when Corey told them we wouldn't be spending time working for 2 months. They were more excited about spending time with Daddy than they were about going to Disneyland! We are going to do some special, once-in-a-lifetime "things" with our kids this summer but mostly, we are just going to enjoy them—together.

I love being a pastor's wife, I really do. Serving God by loving His children—it is a dream come true. I wouldn't change our calling. Not for a million dollars. But I am so looking forward to a time of renewal and refreshment. Corey and I have agreed not to cram activities into our summer but to relax and do life "slower" and more intentional...together. We need this summer and we are so grateful to our church family for gifting this time to us. I would like to ask you to pray for us. Pray for our family as we transition into our sabbatical. We have NEVER spent two months all together before. Pray that this time will be a blessing to our family; that we will be refreshed, renewed and ready to come back to the town we love with a new passion and desire for service. I promise we will be praying for each of you!

Visitation Ministry During the Sabbatical

We have five trained Ministers of Visitation, who are about to be joined by up to five more people who are currently going through Visitation Ministry training. During the pastor's Sabbatical (June 15th-Aug. 15th) Church Leadership asks that you feel free to contact Gary Brunner at 509-339-7130, if you are in need of a visit or know someone that is, and Gary will set you up with a Visitation Minister that best fits your situation. Visitation Ministers are available to do visits in hospitals, nursing homes, homes and out in the community.



Bible Reading Plan: ~ by Pastor Corey

We continue our goal of reading the whole Bible through in one-year. There are many different ways to achieve this goal. The schedule mapped out below is a chronological schedule. The intent is to read the Bible in the actual order that it "unfolded." If you want to do something different than chronological, consider going to: <http://www.bibleplan.org> and take advantage of the many different free plans they offer on that website. If you don't do internet, consider simply doing this: read 2 chapters of the New Testament a day, and 2 chapters of the Old Testament a day. When you finish the New Testament (which will be much sooner than you finish the Old Testament) consider shifting your 2 chapters of reading over to the Old Testament- OR- read 2 chapters of the Gospels each day. Either way you will more than read the whole Bible in a year if you read 4 chapters of scripture each day. There are 929 chapters in the 66 book Bible, so you can get away with reading 3 chapters a day- but reading 4 will help you keep pace and will help you personalize and read areas twice that are especially helpful for you.
