## **Pastor's Column: Life Can Get Ugly Sometimes....**

Things can get ugly fast. That's an age-old, time-tested reality. Much of life circumstances are beyond our control, and sometimes life feels like one pitfall after another. So how do we deal with unforeseen tragedies of life? How do we confront difficult controversy in our midst?

Allow me to make some humble suggestions, based on the teachings of Jesus Christ.

1. **We grieve.** The shortest verse in the Bible is Luke 11:35, "Jesus wept." Jesus had lost his friend Lazarus and he grieved for him. He did not stuff his grief, he did not deny his grief- he grieved. We may be modern, technologically addicted people, but we are not robots, we must take time when tragedy strikes to emotionally experience the loss.
2. **We pray.** When Jesus found out that John the Baptizer had been beheaded, he headed off to a "solitary place" to be alone with God (Matthew 14:12-13). In times of loss we will have strong emotions, and often people are inclined to trust their strong emotions and act out in desperation or anger. It is important to give yourself time with God, to allow God to give perspective so that you don't compound tragedy with words or actions you may later regret. Take time with God, pray.
3. **We Grow.** Jesus was rejected and nearly murdered by a mob in his boyhood town of Nazareth (Luke 4:28-30). Jesus witnessed the heart-breaking controversy and experience of being rejected by his own people that day, his very neighbors threatened his life. We need to realize that in some way we are different because of the tragedy that has occurred. We learn and begin to accept that some things will not be the same because of controversy and tragedy. However, we also can allow God to grow a depth of character in us by bringing us through such challenges. Jesus would face rejection and threats of murder again in his life. At Nazareth, Jesus was growing into His life mission, becoming ready to be our Savior who at Calvary would die in our place and utter "Father forgive them, for they don't know what they are doing" as He died for us.

When tragedy and controversy arrive we have options. We can run. We can bury our head in the sands or in a bottle. We can lash out in anger. We can allow the event to throw us into despair. Or- we can give ourselves into the hands of the One who is truly in control. We can grieve. We can pray. We can allow God to heal us and grow us.

I suggest the way of Jesus to you as the best response to tragedy and controversy. It is the way of true hope. It is the way God forms people into loving servants. God wants people who have weathered the difficulties of life to join Him in bringing more grace, justice, peace, hope and love into the world.

So things can get ugly- but I have to tell you- God can take the ugliness of the world and make it into something beautiful and life-giving if we let Him and trust Him and His ways. God always makes life beautiful.

## Bible Book of the Month of November – Luke

Luke is a historical book written in the first century AD. It is written by Luke, who many think was a doctor, and who reports to have researched before composing this book. Luke is one of the four Gospels, and like the other three, it's main point is to reveal Jesus as the Son of God, however, it has its unique features. Luke, was likely written to a Gentile, or non-Jewish audience, likely Romans. This appears to have influenced Luke and his choices of what Jesus stories to include. Luke has quite a number of stories of Jesus interacting with Gentiles. Also Luke has some parables that are not in the other Gospels, it has a different version of the Lord's Prayer than Matthew, and overall emphasizes justice for the poor. As followers of Jesus, I think we should read Jesus' teachings and life story every year. So I encourage you to read Luke- whether you have read it before or not, schedule some time for it and give it a read.

**Worship Center**

- Empty all trash cans in to the outdoor trash bin.
- Clean & dust window sills, pews, pew pockets and damp wipe as required.
- Dust telephones and disinfect.
- Dust file cabinets, window sills, tables, credenzas, pictures, displays, shelving, chairs, partition tops and furnishings and horizontal surfaces.
- Wipe coffee or drink rings and similar soiling from furniture.
- Vacuum all carpeting and rug areas.
- Spot clean carpet as required.
- Dust and damp mop all hard surfaces and flooring.
- Spot clean all glass including furniture, mirrors, partitions, and interior windows.
- Clean finger marks and soiling from entrance doors.
- Clean pulpit.
- Turn off lights when leaving rooms.
- Secure doors upon completion of work.

**RESTROOMS**

- Stock paper towels, tissue, and hand soap in proper dispensers.
- Empty and resupply bags in trash receptacles and wipe with disinfectant.
- Empty, clean, disinfect and restock sanitary napkin dispensers.
- Clean and polish mirrors, chrome, dispensers and framing.
- Clean and disinfect all sinks, countertops and ledges.
- Spot clean doors and kick plates.
- Clean and disinfect all toilet tops, bowls, bases and seats, both on top and underneath.
- Dust and wipe partitions and framing.
- Remove splash marks on walls.
- Dust and damp mop all hard surfaces with disinfectant.
- Make a note of consumables we are low on to replace.
- Thoroughly dust all surfaces including tables, chairs, window sills, pictures, and furnishings (including fire extinguishers and exit signs as needed).
- Spot clean doors, interior glass, and partition glass (all glass, to ceiling). Dust and damp mop all hard surfaces.
- Damp wipe entrance doors and framing.
- Clean and sanitize countertops, scour and disinfect sinks, polish all bright work.
- Clean and sanitize all tables and counters.
- Clean and disinfect exterior surfaces of refrigerators and insides and outsides of microwave oven.
- Vacuum all carpets, rugs, weather mats, and interior stair wells and wipe railings.
- Put all cleaning supplies back in the proper place.
- Clean coffee bar area and rinse coffee pots and tea urns.
- Police all outside entrances.

The contractor will provide all cleaning materials and chemicals necessary to perform the job.

The majority of this work shall be completed before Wednesday of each week with a requirement of a walk through on Friday or Saturday of each week to spot clean. The work is restricted to the inside of the building except as stated elsewhere in this document.

The Church will provide all consumables such as paper towels and liquid soap for the bathroom and kitchen. The church will provide brooms, mops, buckets, and vacuum cleaner. (The church will contract deep carpet cleaning two times per year.) The kitchen cleaning will be performed by the groups that utilize the area the contractor is responsible for the surface areas and floors.

The proposal should include a weekly charge and a per hour charge for additional cleanings during the year for special events or weddings. Three references with a synopsis of previous cleaning experience are required for a successful bid.

Nov. 11th- 11am at the PFC Bell Tower- we will have a Veteran's Day Service to honor our veterans. Rain or shine we will gather to honor them.

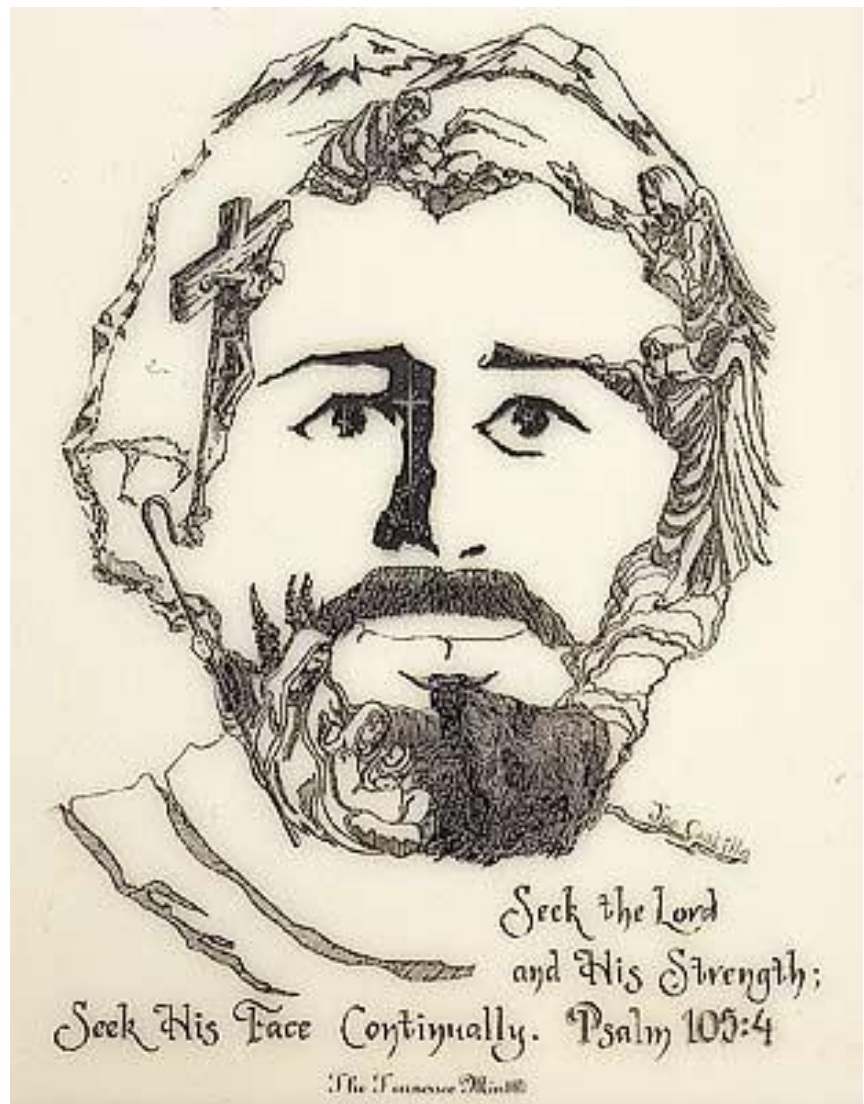


## Father's Heart Children's Home Silent Auction Event

## Tuning Up the Coffee Hour....

Coffee hour at 10am on Sundays is a fun social time for many in our congregation. It is a time where many folks catch up with one another. Also between 10 and 11am is when many visitors to our 11am service begin to come inside. Sometimes the coffee hour is an intimidating experience for someone new to the congregation, who may not know many of our church family yet. How can we help encourage visitors?

1. You can introduce yourself and keep on the lookout for people coming in
2. You can leave a space for a guest at your table
3. You can give them the basics of how coffee hour operates, and what the Sunday morning schedule is. This seems basic to us, but all this stuff is brand-new to visitors
4. You can volunteer to be a coffee hour greeter, staying near the hallway and or door on the lookout to greet people as they come in to coffee hour.

In related news we are going to begin encouraging groups to host coffee hour, mixed in with individuals who also sign up for coffee hour. What does this mean? This means that sometimes a Bible study or ministry group will sign up to host coffee hour as a group. When they do, they will do the normal coffee hour work of providing drinks and snacks, but they will also tell you a bit about their group with printed materials. This will help the congregation learn about the different groups and ministries in our church, and help build connection between the 9 and 11am services.
