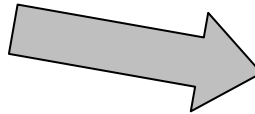

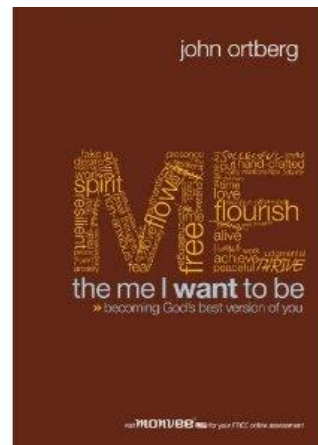

## What Happened to Traditional Youth Group?

Reaching teenagers in a sincere way in our modern culture is not quite the same as years ago. With e-mail, facebook, twitter and texting, peer groups and society are influencing students as much as parents and community adults.

In this culture of connection, students are able to communicate within their peer group virtually at any place and anytime and yet the depth and quality of communication has dwindled to a surface level.

This current trend of relational communication has created an amazing opportunity for adults of all ages to connect to teens in a traditional face to face way. Despite the unwelcoming calloused expressions and negative attitudes, deep down teenagers desire relationships with adults. This is where they secure value, and self-worth. Research by Chap Clark in the book Hurt shows that authentic relationships with adults fill the empty void within their soul. (Especially when parents have become withdrawn)

Taking these concepts into consideration, we are transforming the way to reach youth at Palouse Federated Church. Rather than hosting a typical youth group, our church is adopting methods and supporting the ministry of Young Life in the Gar-Pal school district. These methods take the biblical concept of an incarnational ministry meaning "in the flesh". Young Life (YL) leaders simply need to "show up" in the flesh and build relationships with students. The relationships are established on the student's turf rather than the adults. This means YL leaders go to where kids are: football games, volleyball games, drama presentations, local hang out spots etc. This process draws the adult out of their comfort zone, rather than pulling students out of theirs; which allows for a foundation to sincere relationships.

The ultimate purpose of this "contact work" is to build a relationship that will present an opportunity to invite teens to a youth event or to share the transformational faith in Christ.

Currently we are in the process of praying for volunteer leaders, and praying for hearts of youth to open up to the YL leaders. Please pray for us daily! Our youth are the future of our community and our church! This new approach to youth ministry will not develop quickly. It is an on-going process that requires MANY caring adults. Therefore, I ask, Are YOU caring and willing?

**Meet Butch & Joyce Smith ~ By Pinky Glass**

Butch and Joyce Smith, lovingly referred to as the tall and short of it around here, have been members of our congregation off and on since 1994. I say off and on, because they went to Saipan on a teaching ministry for one year in 2001/2002 and then again in 2003 where Butch was principal of the Saipan Community School.

While living on the island of Guam in 1994–95 where they were associated with the Salvation Army, they visited Saipan, never dreaming they would one day live on the lovely little island. In 2001, the opportunity came when Butch was online and found a third grade teaching position open at Saipan Community School. He applied and was hired. The English-speaking K thru 8th grade school sponsored by the Saipan Community Church, a General Baptist Church, averaged 200 students from South Korea, Japan, China, Philippines and Saipan. During their time on Saipan they traveled to the island of Tinian, the island of Bali in Indonesia, Australia, Thailand and New Zealand. Both agreed it was a great experience-Joyce loved the warm weather, while Butch enjoyed the air-conditioned workspaces

The couple was interested in visiting the island of Saipan, as Joyce's father, Clarence Rogers, a contingent of the Army supply Corp., was stationed on Saipan during World War II. In November of 2009, Butch assisted his father-in-law and other World War II veterans during the Honor Flight out of Spokane to visit the World War II Memorial in Washington D.C. Joyce's parents, Clarence and Ruth Rogers live in Yakima and visit with us in Palouse from time to time.

Prior to their island time, Butch was Chairman of the Board here at PFC and Doug Willcox was Treasurer. In 2000, these two gentlemen formed the "Holy Smith- Willcox Construction Firm" which was the driving force and daily builders of our Fellowship Hall. While the entire congregation joined in with whatever spiritual and physical talents they possessed, it is safe to say without Butch and Doug and the Lord at the helm we would not have the fantastic gathering place for fellowship, meeting spaces and community outreach ministry that we enjoy today

Upon returning to Palouse in June, 2006, Butch and Joyce became active in our church once again. Butch is once more Chairman of our Federated Church Board. He is easily spotted towering over the crowd, so don't hesitate to stop him and tell him how you think things are going at PFC. Positives, negatives or questions of any kind are welcomed and encouraged. If the answer is not on the tip of his tongue, he will pursue it and his parting remark will be "I'll find out and get back to you." Joyce leads the merry band of workers in the kitchen activities, is a member of the church's "Prayer Warriors" and sings with the 9 AM worship team, always with a big smile and a frequent giggle. She is looking forward to being part of the newly formed Ministry of Visitation Team and both she and Butch are excited to be on the Young Life Board. You may look around on some Sundays and wonder where the Smiths are. Chances are they are in the Tri-Cities visiting family and doing odd jobs or in Spokane attending grandchildren activities. They are never idle be it church, community tasks or a myriad of callings. When a helping hand is needed, it is often found at the end of Butch and/or Joyce's arms accompanied by a smile and the statement "Remember, Jesus loves you"



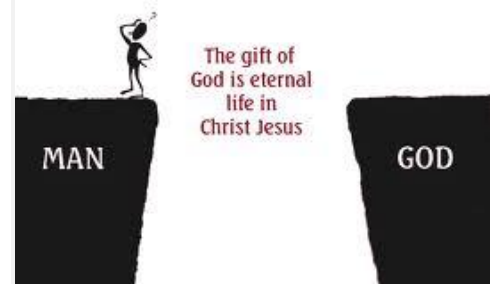
## HELP WANTED CLASSIFIEDS
